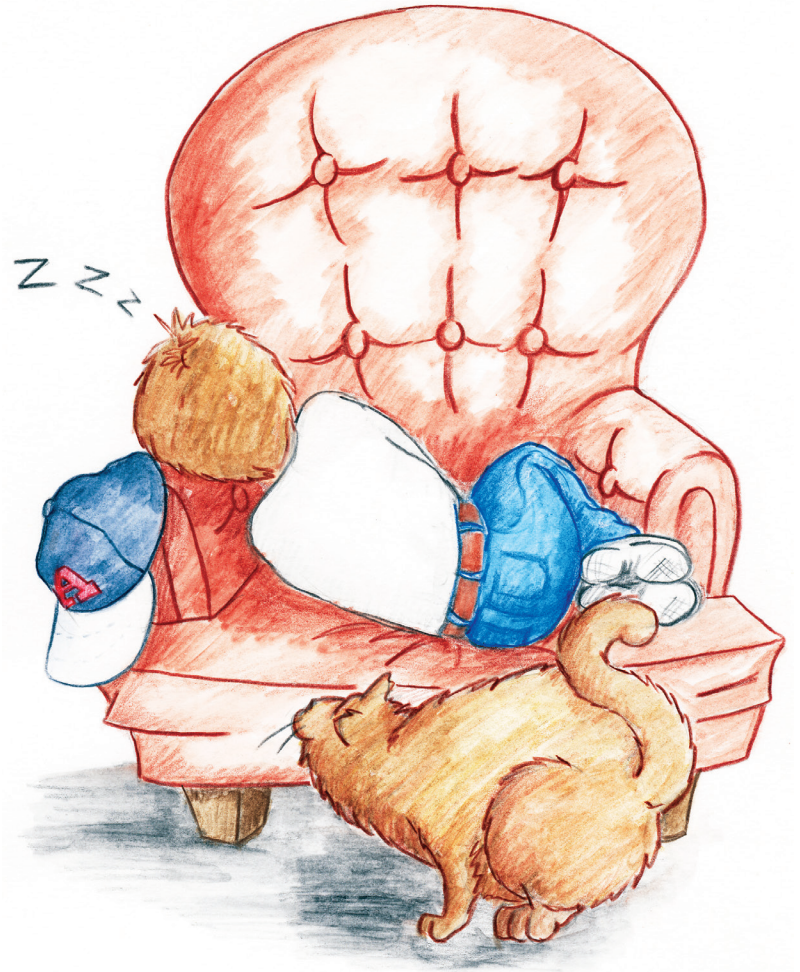
**Sam has a tan cat.

Max is in Sam's lap.



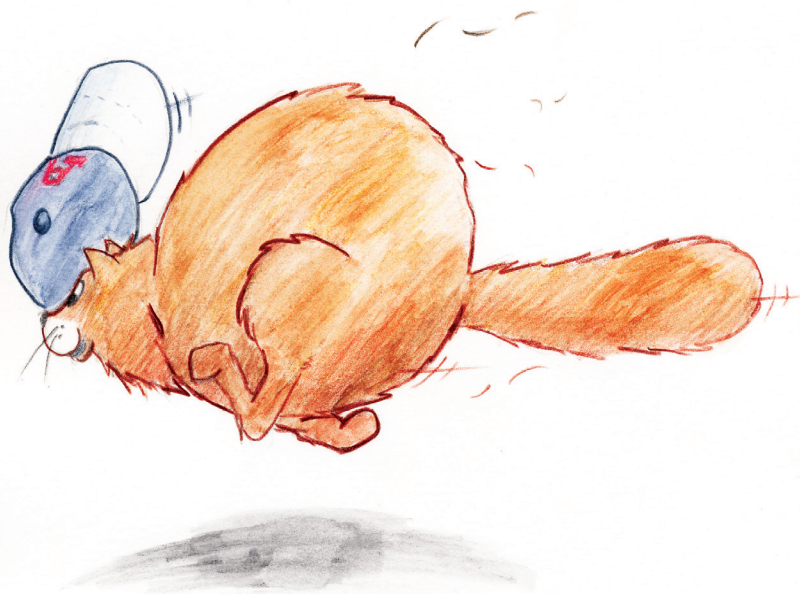
Sam has a cap.

Comprehension (discussion with reader)

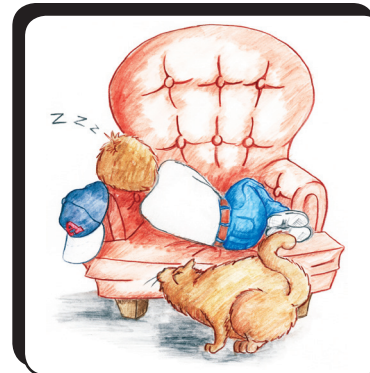
1. Who is Sam?

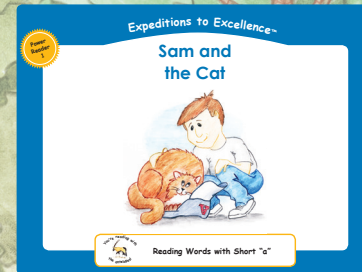
