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




Joe woke up and said, "I will roam and roam. I will look for a home."




Joe saw a mole poke its nose up from a hole. Joe was too big for a mole's hole!


"That is not a home for a goat," said Joe.

Joe met a tan dog. The dog was on a rope. The rope was on a pole. Wag, wag, went the dog's tail.




The dog was happy to see Joe.

Joe gave the dog a bone.


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"Will you untie this rope? You can come in my home," said the dog.
