Getting Ready - A Broad View of the Landscape Before You Begin

It's highly unlikely that you'll ever meet a farm animal on a real African safari. Nevertheless, that's exactly what you and your reader will do on this expedition. Ted, the main character in our next power reader, has a red hen named Bess for his pet. Of course, you have probably already surmised that our words for this session all focus on the short "e" sound, and are created from the short "e" blends your reader mastered while on an earlier expedition.

Use the same approach teaching the words in this expedition as you did with short "a" words. Prepare for this expedition by turning to page 45 in The Reading Place, entitled "Reading Words with Short 'e'". At the top of each word list in the section, you will see a box with the blended sounds of "e" that your reader has already mastered. As you help your safari mate read the words on each list aloud, remember the guidelines for

blending words. Always blend letters with as few breaks as possible. Use your finger to help "glide" through the word - never "hop" from one letter sound to the next. When all of the short "e" words have been mastered, teach the sight words that are also listed. Then, read the practice sentences on page 49. Your reader will soon be ready to read Power Reader 2, entitled Bess, the Red Hen. What a smart reader you have! What fun he or she will have getting to know Ted and his pet hen!



Taking a Closer Look - Sample Dialogue to Help Direct Your Course

Tour Guide: "We have a very unusual expedition planned for our safari today."

Reader: "Why is it unusual?"

Tour Guide: "Well, it says here in my instructions that we're going to meet a boy named

Ted who has a rare red hen named Bess for a pet. Red hens are farm animals, so it's very unusual to meet them while out on a safari. In addition, most hens are brown or white. We'll need to take along our imaginations, won't we?"

Reader: "Yes - I have my imagination with me."

Tour Guide: "Good. Bess (the hen), Ted, and all of the words we'll learn today have the short 'e' sound that says 'eh'. (Shows child the word list in The Reading Place.) You've already learned all of the

sounds in the boxes at the top of each list. Let's review them together. Then, we'll practice

putting consonants in front of them to make words. Shall we begin?"

How many times a day do you feel thirsty? Some varieties of antelope can go for a long time without water, sometimes days or weeks. That makes them perfectly suited for the hot African plain. They get moisture from leaves and green plants that they eat.

What You'll Need to Pack for the Safari



You will need *The Reading Place* (pages 45-49), Power Reader 2, entitled *Bess, the Red Hen*, lots of imagination and of course, a happy face.


Results to Achieve During Your Expedition


