## Getting Ready - A Broad View of the Landscape Before You Begin



Tour Guide's note: Remember to review the word lists from the previous expeditions as you progress. Words from the expeditions already mastered will continue to appear in the Power Readers. Take time to play tracks 1-7 of the CD, frequently. Learning the fundamental concepts of reading along with music will provide a firm foundation for your reader. Just as you can remember the words to old songs you may not have heard for decades, your reader can embed the rules of reading in his or her brain for a lifetime, because they will have been learned to the

music of fun and catchy tunes.

This expedition begins on page 57 of *The Reading Place* in the section entitled "Reading Words with Short 'o'". As you have done in the previous expeditions, pay close attention in helping your safari mate to blend these words properly. When all of the "o" words have been mastered, teach the sight words included in the section for short "o". Be sure to take time and master the practice sentences as well. Your reader will then be ready to read Power Reader 4, entitled *The Fox and the Box*. Look at the cover of the Power Reader together. Can he or she guess what might be in the box before you begin?



## Taking a Closer Look - Sample Dialogue to Help Direct Your Course

Tour Guide: "The next book is called The Fox and the Box. It's about a fox that has a surprise in a box for his friend. Let's read these next word lists and try and guess which things might be in his box that are on the word lists. When we're finished reading the words in The Reading Place, we'll read the book and see if we were right!"



Reader: "Okay! I'll bet that I can guess what's in the box!"

**Tour Guide:** "I won't be surprised if you're right. You're a very smart boy (or girl)."

(It might be a fun idea for the Tour Guide to put a surprise in a box for the reader to open if he or she masters all of the words in the expedition. It could be a special toy, a special treat to eat, a coloring book, or anything the reader would consider very special!)




