#### Getting Ready - A Broad View of the Landscape Before You Begin



Because he or she has completed the last expedition, your reader recognizes the seven irregular vowel combinations with "e" which are featured in this section. Turn to page 161 in The Reading Place. You will now teach your safari mate how to read words containing the same irregular vowel combinations. As you have in the past, help your safari mate to read the words in each word list. Help him or her to blend the letters together. As your reader masters each list, progress to the next list, until all of the lists for this expedition are mastered, including sight words. Irregular

vowels are tricky, so you may need to progress at a slower pace than you are used to.

At the conclusion of the expedition, is Power Reader 18. It includes only mastered words. If your reader seems to have an unusual level of difficulty with any power reader, review those words that seem to pose consistent problems, and then return to the power reader again. The power reader for this expedition is called The New Sleigh. You might enhance the reading session by pretending to hear sleigh bells or the sounds of the horse's trotting hooves. Encouraging your reader to use all of the senses in pretend play (what they hear, smell, feel, etc.) will aid them in the future when they try their hand at creative writing or tell imaginary stories of their own



#### Taking a Closer Look - Sample Dialogue to Help Direct Your Course

Tour Guide: "Now we can blend the words in our next word lists and read Power Reader 18. Power Reader 18 is called *The New Sleigh*. Let's close our eyes and pretend we're riding across snow-covered hills in a sleigh pulled by horses. What are the horses' names? What do they look like? Is it cold outside? What's that I hear - sleigh bells? Where are we going in our horse-drawn sleigh? Let's find out where the sleigh in our power reader is going!"

## The Golden Page

When reading chapter books, the title of each chapter is often "hidden" as a phrase somewhere in the pages that follow. Whether you or your

safari mate are doing the reading, be on the lookout for the title words. The page that contains them is the "golden" page", and the person who discovers the golden page can earn points or

any other special surprise you deem appropriate.

Do you ever wear sunglasses to shield you from the bright sunlight? A giraffe can't wear sunglasses, but it has extra-long black eyelashes that shade its eyes from the bright sun on the African plain.


# Results to Achieve During Your Expedition
