Taking a Closer Look - Sample Dialogue to Help Direct Your Course

Tour Guide:	"Remember how easy the last expedition was?"
Reader:	"It was great!"

Reader:	"No problem!"
Tour Guide:	"Here they are. What does 'uy' say?"

Together:	"buy, guy"
Tour Guide:	"That's all there is to it. Can you read them by yourself?"

Does your reader need extra encouragement to pick up a book? He or she is not alone! Just make sure that there are books readily available and accessible on his or her favorite topics. Some favorite topics often include dinosaurs, dolls, airplanes, dogs, cats and horses. The important thing is to zero in on what might interest your friend or safari mate. It's okay if he or she just looks at the pictures. The first goal is to stimulate an interest in books. The words and the reading will follow.
