Getting Ready - A Broad View of the Landscape Before You Begin



Thirty days hath September, April, June and November...do you remember this old saying? Well, we've updated it and put it to music. Hopefully, you and your reader will enjoy learning it the "modern" way. This expedition will teach the number of days in each month as well as the silent sound of "gh" in words. Power Reader 25 entitled, As Night Turns to Day uses many of the words with the silent "gh" sound. Just read and master the word lists for this expedition, enjoy singing the song and have fun with the power reader.

To begin the expedition, pick a nice cozy spot under the baobab tree and imagine that you can hear nothing at all - total silence. That's the sound of the silent "gh". Now, you're ready to find the section featuring your word lists on page 213 of *The Reading Place*. Read the silent "gh" words with your safari mate. Notice in the first group of words, the "gh" is silent and that it transforms the vowel "i" into its long sound.

In the second list, the "gh" is also silent, and it turns the "ou" or "au" into the "aw" sound.

Sometimes it is helpful to re-write these words on a separate piece of paper and to have the reader actually cross out the "gh" to emphasize the point. One of the Funsheets in this expedition folder demonstrates this.

After your reader can successfully read the words on both lists with ease, and has also mastered the sight words associated with this expedition, he or she is ready to read our next fun story, entitled As Night Turns to Day. (At the end of the story, turn to the section entitled, Conversation Station. Listen to the song Thirty Days Has September to teach your reader to determine how many days are in each of the twelve months. This song can be found on track 24. (The words are printed on the following page.)

Taking a Closer Look - Sample Dialogue to Help Direct Your Course

Tour Guide: "This expedition is all about 'nothing'."

Reader: "Nothing?"

Tour Guide: "That's right! It's all about two letters that say nothing at all! They just

sit in the middle of a word and don't make one peep. They're the silent 'gh' team. Their mission is to get inside a word and say absolutely nothing at all. It would be easy to just crumple them up and throw them away, except that

they have a few magical powers and they can suddenly change the sound of the vowels in a word, so no one wants to throw them out. Let's turn to page 213 of *The Reading Place* and I'll show you

the silent 'gh' team."




