### Getting Ready - A Broad View of the Landscape Before You Begin



Remember, a prefix is a word or a syllable which is put in front of another word to add to or change its meaning. Flash Card Set 24 contains the prefixes shown on the item list for this expedition. Say the prefix sounds out loud. Ask, your reader to repeat the sounds after you. Next, shuffle the flash cards and present them randomly. When all of the prefixes have been mastered and the activities in this folder have been completed, progress to the next expedition, which will entail reading words with these same prefixes.

There is something a little tricky about one of the prefixes in this expedition. The prefix "a" that appears in words such as,

around aside amuse away

does not follow the Lonely Vowel Rule. It is an exception to the rule. Instead of saying its long sound, the "a" says its short sound. For the purposes of this expedition, introduce the prefix, but move quickly beyond it to the other prefixes in the group. It is easier to teach the prefix "a" in the context of the words that contain that prefix in the next expedition.

#### Taking a Closer Look - Sample Dialogue to Help Direct Your Course

Tour Guide: "You know, the Safari Success Trail says that the flamingo is tickled pink

because you're doing so very well! I think you're doing incredibly well, too. It

won't be long until you earn your reading diploma."

Reader: "I can't wait to get my diploma!"

Tour Guide: "Can you think of something special to do to celebrate when you finish all of

the reading expeditions?"

Reader: "Yes - I'd like to do ..."

Tour Guide: "That sounds like a deal! Right now, we'll look at our new set of prefixes. There are nine of them.

I know you'll learn them quickly. Let's begin."
