#### Getting Ready - A Broad View of the Landscape Before You Begin

A suffix or a word ending is...a word or a syllable which is put at the end of another word to alter (or change) its meaning.

Flash Card Set 26 contains the suffixes for this expedition. Familiarize your reader with these suffixes by saying the suffix sounds out loud, asking him or her to repeat after you.

Next, hold up each flash card asking, "Can you say this suffix?" When all of the suffixes have been mastered, progress to the next expedition, which will include reading words with these same suffixes.

### Taking a Closer Look - Sample Dialogue to Help Direct Your Course

Tour Guide: "Do you remember where we found prefixes in words?"

Reader: "At the beginning of the word."

Tour Guide: "That's right! We're going to learn what suffixes are today. Suffixes are

found at the end of a word. They are put at the end of a word to change the

meaning of the word. Let me show you what I mean."

Reader: "Okay."

Tour Guide: (Writes this on a piece of paper) "Here is an example of a suffix, 'est'. Can you say this?"

Reader: "est"

Tour Guide: "That was easy wasn't it? (Child nods) Now, let's put 'est' on the end of another word we already

know - 'fast'. (Tour Guide writes 'fast' on paper) It becomes 'fastest'. You are not only a 'fast'

learner, but you are the 'fastest' learner I know! Do you see how suffixes work?"

Reader: "Yes."

Tour Guide: "First, we'll just learn the suffixes on these flash cards. In the next expedition, we'll add

words we know to them and, magically, we'll be able to read longer words. And, since you are the

'fastest' learner I know, it'll be a breeze!"

Snakes are covered with scales. The scales keep the snake from drying out in the hot sun by keeping moisture inside the snake's body.

Suffixes and word endings are like the cabooses on the ends of words.


